I. THE STATISTICS

♦ In 2012 there were 268 unintentional Deaths in San Diego County from prescription drugs.

(There were 68 deaths from flu)

 Nationwide we have seen a 4 fold increase in opioid deaths over the past 10 years, and a 10 fold increase in number of pills prescribed.

105 people a day die nation wide from prescription drug abuse

- More people die from prescription drugs than heroin and cocaine combined
- The US is 4.6% of the world population and consumes

80% of world's opioids

99% of the world's hydrocodone

2/3 world's illegal drugs



Number of Deaths From Poisoning,* Drug Poisoning,† and Drug Poisoning Involving Opioid Analgesics§ — United States, 1999–2010




4 x increase in deaths due to opioids

PER 100,000 PEOPLE, 2008


